

WHEN YOU HEAR EMERGENCY SIRENS - DO THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. a) Tune into local radio and television broadcasters.
 - b) Monitor Atikokan weather radio at 162.400 mhz.
- Listen for Instructions Energency Radio 91.1FM

DURING AN EMERGENCY

Sirens may sound continuously. This will indicate a state of emergency occurring in the broadcast area. Please keep listening to the radio or TV for further information. Do NOT call these stations or any of the area's emergency services unless there is a direct threat to your safety or anybody else's immediate safety. We are aware of the present emergency situation and it is necessary to keep the phone lines open.

DURING A SIREN TEST

On the 1st Wednesday of each month at 2pm the sirens will sound for a short period This will indicate a test only being conducted in the broadcast area and is NOT an emergency situation. We repeat, this is NOT an emergency situation.

- 3. If an Evacuation Order is Given Do the Following:
 - a) Dress for the season.
 - b) If on medication, take it with you.
 - c) Turn off appliances such as stove, TV, etc. Lock house.
 - d) Proceed to the emergency receiving centre as directed (see map for locations).
- 4. If NO evacuation order is announced, staying at home is safest.

CHEMICAL SPILL OR LEAK

- a) If evacuation of your zone or area is advised proceed immediately in the direction indicated. Zones are found on the map. Directions will be determined by weather conditions, location and nature of the spill or leak.
- b) If trapped in the building, the nature of the chemical involved will determine where to locate. If the chemical is lighter than air, locate at the lowest point possible in the building. If the chemical is heavier than air, locate at the highest point possible in the building. Close all doors and windows and seal with available material. Use wet rags, tape, or whatever is available. Turn off air intakes i.e. fans, HRV units.

SEVERE WINDS - TORNADOES

- a) If you hear a tornado warning has been issued. Take cover IMMEDIATELY.
- b) Remain in building go to lowest level in a small interior room such as a bathroom, hallway, basement, storm cellar or closet beneath the stairs.
- c) If none of these are available, sit underneath a sturdy piece of furniture on the ground floor in the center of the building and protect your head and face.
- d) Stay away from outside walls and windows.
- e) Discuss the shelter areas with your family.

NOTE: If you are in an OFFICE or APARTMENT BUILDING take shelter in an inner hallway or room preferably in the basement or on the ground floor.

NOTE: If you are OUTSIDE or in a VEHICLE, do NOT remain in the vehicle. Take shelter elsewhere. If no shelter is available, lie down in a ditch or low lying area away from the automobile, BUT be aware of flooding and be prepared to move.
